Training Centre Overview

Our Training Centre has been an asset in helping further developing our athletes at all levels, providing additional training time on top of on-ice programming for our teams. We have been able to provide training programs that cater to the specific needs of individual athletes.

We have generated extra revenue by renting out our facility to outside parties, but the priority is for VMHA members first. However, we have faced challenges with weak flooring upstairs causing safety hazards and tight scheduling making it difficult to accommodate all teams. We plan to explore solutions such as upgrading the flooring, booking time in advance, and creating better programs to improve our services and expand our reach.

6 out 7 rep teams committed to a 10 week program that included weights, strength training, dryland and shot / stickhandling designed for age groups. Some of the rep teams even used the facility more than once a week. Two C teams also completed a 10 week program. Many of the remaining C teams accessed the facility between 1 to 5 times. The facility will help players to reach the next level, improve shoot & stick handling as interest level has improved just in one season. VMHA has a list of approved trainers and skill providers to ensure this facility addresses extra training where more ice is just unavailable and will fill the gaps.

- Ensuring the conduct of the selection of committee members, and the Board election meets standards of good governance and the expectations of the members.

It's true that life always throws curve balls, which is something that this board and previous board before us have been successful to stick handle and still deliver a great hockey program despite uncontrollable events. With Covid now behind us, the unexpected shut down of the Agrodome which handles close to 33% of our ice was shut down for 7 weeks this past season. Between the hockey ops committee, ice allocator and our understanding coaches; we all came together to ensure ice was made available to everyone in the fairest process.

This was our start to the season. I would like to thank everyone, especially Lana who had to redo that seasonal schedule not once, not twice but 3 times. As the season settled in, we have been trying different approaches to engage every player, team, parents and coaches to find useful ways to maximize the training center. Just 2 years ago, the concept was relatively new. Today, there have been many facilities opening in the Lower Mainland. With lack of ice, the concept of the training center needs to be adapted into our programming. There are so many benefits to owning this facility. Many thanks to our rep teams and C teams who took advantage of the training center during the past season. Our on ice skills were cut short due to the Agrodome issue, but we were able to continue skills through the pop up clinics for the remaining season. Structured and scheduled times may be difficult due to ice being taken away from us due to other users. In order to maintain extra ice times, the reality of sharing practices may come to fruition sooner than later as many MHAs across the Lower Mainland have been doing so for years.

We were able to combine picture day with VMHA community day once again. This is a great event where members can engage with other members while enjoying the 3 on 3 mini tournament and other activities. Our annual Christmas Tournament finally came back post Covid where many of our C teams were well represented along with a couple A2 teams. Though primarily a charity tournament with the Canucks Place as the primary recipient, partial proceeds also goes towards VMHA's general operating expenses. We are hoping to grow this tournament back to over 60 teams next season.

Our U18A & C players were well represented in their respective PCAHA's scholarship showcase tournaments. Unfortunately, none of our U21 group were able to attend due to other commitments.

The lack of commitment to this year's annual hockey pool was not as successful as in previous years. Maybe there was too much team fundraising or the lack of understanding of why we need to fundraise as an association is so critical. This is the single largest fundraiser for VMHA and the easiest. Everyone by now knows that costs for living expenses & goods post Covid have gone up dramatically. VMHA is affected by rising costs of ice, referees / development, skills sessions, poaching of paid coaches & skill providers are just a few that come to mind. Without fundraising, further increases will continue to happen. Basically, we all need to be better.

As we entered the final months, many rep teams played in the final four or presidents' playoffs. Congratulations to the U15A2 on winning the league title and the U11A1 for the presidents series playoff. League winners for C was U11C4 & Banner Champs U11C4. Also a special shout out to all of the other teams when in tournament play or in play offs that represented VMHA.

In closing, lots of planning for the upcoming season is underway, introduction & implementation of new committees to help shape, including the overall health of Vancouver Minor Hockey for years to

come. To all of the volunteers, coaches, team staff, div managers and administrative staff; thank you from the bottom of my heart for helping our players in having an enjoyable season. To our board members who are stepping down from their roles after many years of service, James Nedilia – VP2, Michelle Young – Ref Assignor, Elizabeth Urbach – Equipment Manager, Kevin Kimura – Coach Coordinator and Lindsay Kelly – Secretary....Your unwavering commitment and time for the betterment of our association to provide the best possible experience for our players goes without notice. Strengthening the goalie department and providing in-season training instructors will be vital to our program's success. We had 42 teams attend 630 players, and our raffle and 50/50 raised \$9000 for our charities – Canucks Place Children's Hospice and Canucks Autism Network – and \$9000 for our Association. These funds go towards helping lower our fees and costs for camps throughout the year.

While we do not intend to make it mandatory to participate in the tournament as other Associations might, we do have an expectation that our own teams participate as we are the host. Looking forward to full participation next year!

We also did well with sponsorships, and are looking forward to even more sponsorships next year with an earlier start. Thank you, VMHA referees, for yet another successful season. Under the leadership of our new Referee-in-Chief, Rupert Xu, our officials started the season with a lot of supervision, which helped them to grow as an official. Throughout the season, we have seen steady improvements. A number of our 4th year officials are being noticed and were sent to work U15AAA games and even at PCAHA U13 Tier 1 and Tier 3 BC Provincials. This is a great opportunity and accomplishment for VMHA officials.

Within VMHA, there are 80 active officials who are still players themselves plus 10 adult officials. 30 of whom are new 1st year officials this year. 18 of them are 2nd year officials. Needless to say, retention of experienced officials has always been a challenge, not just for VMHA but for all

associations. Our hope is to continue to provide training and more opportunities for our keen officials to continue their officiating career.

Referee-In-Chief Rupert Xu

The Referee-In-Chief of VMHA assumes all responsibilities for, and oversight of, the officials and officiating program of the Association. The RIC is responsible for recruiting and development of young officials into the system to ensure the program remains vibrant and the Association's needs are met. The position of the RIC is critical to the ongoing development, mentorship and success of the VMHA officials.

Our new RIC, Rupert Xu, has had a very busy season with our officials. Rupert was responsible for the development and training, recruitment, evaluation, mentorship, assignment, and oversight of the Association's officiating program. Some of his responsibilities included:

- Ensure that the referee program supports the Association's needs including development, recruitment and succession plans to meet game demand and referee attrition
- Monitor, supervise and evaluate all active officials within the Association, including conducting on-ice instruction for the purpose of upgrading minor hockey official levels and completing evaluation forms
- Coordinate and facilitate referee clinics and additional training during the season
- Monitor, supervise, evaluate and provide feedback to active referees regarding their knowledge and application of the rules of hockey and on-ice performances
- Asked officials monthly rulebook questions
- Recommended VMHA officials to U15AAA tournaments
- Assisted with organizing officials for our VMHA tournament and provided supervision and constructive feedback to officials
- Liaise with the VMHA Referee Assignor to ensure all games have scheduled officials

We've seen the hard work, support and care you've invested in our officials this season. Thank you for motivating our officials to set goals and strive diligently to accomplish them.

Risk Management - VP3 Quyen Cheng

Keeping all VMHA members safe is our priority, from dealing with physical injuries to ensuring our dressing rooms, stands and events are safe havens for everyone. Policies and procedures are in place to create and maintain safe programs in safe facilities overseen by qualified and/or trained volunteers or staff. All minor hockey teams in Canada must have a HCSP – certified Safety Person. The emphasis is on injury prevention and safety through risk management and education.

If a player or team official is injured during a game, a HCSP must complete the online VMHA team injury report. If an injury requires medical referral and/or hospitalization, a Hockey Canada Injury Report and Return to Play form are to be completed and submitted. For the 2022–23 hockey season, we received 20 injury reports from various teams in our association. It is important that all HCSPs in our association continue to report any injuries and complete the required forms. VMHA is committed to providing a safe, respectful, and fully inclusive environment for players, parents/guardians, staff and volunteers.
